

NATIONAL POLLUTANT RELEASE INVENTORY

The National Pollutant Release Inventory (NPRI) is a program created and maintained by Environment and Climate Change Canada. It provides information about pollutant releases (to the air, water and land), disposals and transfers for recycling. This program is paired with other requirements, reported as one (partnered programs). For example, part of the requirements for the Toxic Reporting Act (TRA) requires companies to report in tandem with NPRI.

The primary goal of NPRI is to track and monitor pollutant released across Canada and data collected is made available to the public. NPRI is updated annually using Environment and Climate Change Canadas secure 'Single Window' system.

Facilities with certain 'North American Industry Classification System' (NAICS) codes are required to annual monitor their releases for NPRI and its partners. Companies that are required to report and choose not to, or knowingly report false information will be prosecuted as outlined under Section 272 and 273 of the Canadian Environmental Protection Act.

NPRI is an annual program, due on June 1st. Data is always reported for the previous calendar year.

Reporting Thresholds:

Any NPRI targeted facility that meets or exceeds the reporting criteria is required to provide the information required by NPRI and its partners. If a facility does not exceed, they may report voluntarily. Facilities must report for an additional three years after a previously exceeding parameter has fallen below reporting thresholds.
