An Environmental Audit (Audit) is an evaluation of a facilities practices, procedures, and policies. The purpose of Audits is to determine if a facility is in compliance with environmental guidelines. In addition, Audits can also ensure the effectiveness of company policies. Audits can be conducted for a wide range of concerns (ex: waste, energy, and water audits).

Audits can be very beneficial for companies (for both the owners and the employees). Failure to comply with regulations may lead to fines and prosecution under various legislations.
